
MCW project Roadmap

- Detailed delivery plans, including outcomes and targets / KPIs for each of the 6 MCW-KRAs.








Malaysia Corruption Watch (MCW) is an independent, non-governmental and non-partisan organisation committed to help Malaysia fight against corruption.





 Undermine democratic institution and the rule of law. Offices and institutions lose their legitimacy when they're misused for private advantage. An example of corruption is a government that pretends to be for the protection of people, but is selecting vendors based on how their contracts will benefit them personally. 	 Citizens compelled to pay for service that should be FREE. Affects lives. Substandard quality of goods and service- example, building collapse (killing innocent people, due to contract being awarded to inefficient companies who paid bribes to win the contract. Undermine people's TRUST in the political system, institutions and LEADERSHIP.
ENVIRONMENTAL	ECONOMICAL
 Our natural resources (Balak,etc) are carelessly exploited and ecological systems are ravaged due to non-enforcement of environmental law. An example of corruption is environmental is through issuing of illegal permits and licences for natural resource exploitation. 	 ROBBING national wealth. Public resources are diverted in projects that will line the pockets rather than benefit communities such as schools, hospitals and roads. World Bank estimated the total amount of bribes paid in developing and developed countries in 2001/2002 at 1 trillion dollars, about 3% of world GDP>




Free MALAYSIA from all form of corruption.

- Malaysia Corruption Watch (MCW) aims to ensure that the custodians of public resources act responsibly to advance the interests of the public, and to ensure that opportunities for entering into corrupt relationships are reduced.
- Our primary objective, therefore, is to encourage and enable active public participation in combatting corruption by reporting experiences of corruption in Malaysia.



MCW Strategic Framework





MCW provides a platform for reporting corruption

MCW build campaigns that mobilise people to take a stand against corruption

MCW gather and analyse information to identify patterns and hot spots of corruption.

MCW stand to be LEADER to all NGOs in fighting corruption Anyone can safely share what they experience and observe and can speak out against corruption. Our communication channels include our website, an Whatsapp line, social media, email or post.

Our campaigns involve the public, community groups and other organisations such as trade unions and NGOs to support MACC initiatives (GERAH).

We prepare research reports on these hot spots to expose and find solutions to systemic corruption. Using our own communication platforms and the media, we share our findings with the public, like-minded non-governmental organisations (NGOs) and public & private sector bodies, all of which are undermined by corruption.

Our **ACTION must speak louder then WORDS**. MCW must show leadership by being independent but working closely with MACC to curb corruption and bribery in Malaysia.





PROPOSED 6 – KRAs for MCW Outcomes

MCW 6 KRAs



Monitoring on corruption practices in Malaysia via reporting and responding to corrupt conduct to authorities for immediate action.



Improving public's confidence towards MACC and Government's anti corruption efforts and activities



Urge government to implement measures to reduce corruption opportunities based on research, data findings and public engagement.



Raise awareness and educate people on knowing their duty and rights to fight corruption.



Making MCW as role model NGO to other country that emphasize Integrity and anti-corruption as No.1 priority.



Engagement agent or strategic partner to MACC to collaborate with other NGOs in terms of coalition for Good Governance, Integrity, and anti corruption campaign.



Focus




Delivery

Landed on 6 MCW - KRA (Key Result Areas) & KPI

- Successful shift from inputs / activities to outcomes / KPI
- Early signs of delivery (e.g., using members and outsiders feedback)
- To be more pro-active in reaching out for programs.
- More effective coalition engagement (e.g. PENMAS, NGOs, Agencies and States)
